OUR VOLUNTEERS ARE READY FOR MEMBERS' SERVICE REQUESTS



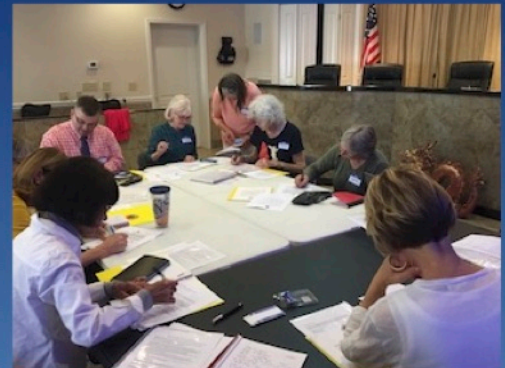
As of March 1, we are thrilled to report that Neuse Neighbors Network has trained over 47 volunteers and our team is growing every day!
